Always keep the scrapbook up-to-date, and

be responsible for HI-Y exhibits and posters.

HERE ARE SOME GUIDELINES TO FOLLOW

Drawing and lettering should be visible from across a large room.

Splashy colors, or bold black and white, put across the idea best.

Avoid a jumble of ideas on one poster - keep it simple.

Unless one is elected, the Historian also serves as Parliamentarian. Study to be accurately informed on proper parliamentary procedure.

HI-Y Scrapbook

HI-Ys keep a scrapbook of their year's activities to . . .

- use to recruit members
- tell their story to the public and local organizations
- tell other HI-Ys what they've done
- help next year's members plan
- have a record of what the HI-Y has accomplished.

Generally, a scrapbook could include . . .

- all activities, projects, events, conferences
- pictures
- copies of news articles and other publicity
- pictures of bulletin boards
- reports of each project and activity including pictures of members who participated.
